

At the end of the story, I have spoken to Dick Baker, the District Commander, and he has set up a special "catch up" re-run of his Commander's seminar the night before our Door County Executive Committee meeting, so I will be caught up in that regard. Skipping ahead to the future, I expect to be caught up soon and we should have an excellent year.

In the beginning, my brother Dave called about a month ago, he was going off the treatments for an aggressive lung cancer. A couple of days later Patsy and I scheduled a quick visit to Minnesota over 10-12 March. We found Dave in obviously failing health, but he was still able to navigate somewhat and hold a conversation as long as it wasn't too long. We came back to Wisconsin to prepare for the Conference, but by the 16th, Dave was in hospice care. We had a subdued birthday celebration for Patsy with the DeNotos on the 17th, and then Patsy and I left Wisconsin together, but in different directions. Patsy was on a mission of life, attending to the birth of our first grandchild in Texas. I was on a mission of transition from life, heading back to Minnesota.

I arrived at the hospice, and Dave was drifting in and out of consciousness. Before this story started, Dave and I helped my mother in her passing. We had some family albums, and we spent many hours describing the events and people that had meaning for her. Now I have brought the albums from Dave's childhood. I began, and his attention became riveted to the albums. He strained to look at the pictures, and I continued in a quiet voice for some time. It was clear that he understood the what and the why of it. His wife Cheryl was there with his adopted family. Their love for each other showed during this time of trial. He raised his lips for a kiss every time she was close.

By Tuesday he had passed into unresponsiveness, and it was clear that the end was soon. The minister arrived, and with family all around, Cheryl gave Dave permission to die as her heart broke, and so he did. Amanda's water broke around midnight, and by morning life was renewed.

I wanted to be at the Council Webinar, but instead I wrote a memorial for my brother's funeral. The Conference meeting and the Funeral were at the same time. Oh that I could be there, rather than what I had to do. It is so unnatural for the old to bury the young.

A long time ago, Dave and I each had our teddy bears. He never had any biological children, and where others had pictures of their children on their desks, Dave had a photo of his bear. His step-grandchildren had the bear placed in the casket with Dave during the visitation. When asked if they wanted the bear as a remembrance of Dave, they said no; the bear should go to heaven with Dave...

Home now, all the activity is over. I come home to a quiet, empty house; wandering around I spot the bear. Motivated to pick it up for the first time in decades, I hold it for a while and stare out the window, trying to come to terms as the sole survivor of my family..... Life will go on, because life must, and the fabric of life will assume importance again.



SPRING INTO BOATING **A Handy Pre-launch Checklist**

Before you launch your boat this spring follow these steps:

- Inspect and lubricate seal cocks.
- Inspect hoses and hose clamps and replace if necessary.
- Replace deteriorated zines.
- Inspect propellers for dings, pitting and distortion.
- Make sure cotter pins are secure. Grip the propeller and try moving the shaft; if it is loose the cutlass bearing may need to be replaced.
- Check to make sure the rudderstock hasn't been bent.
- Inspect the hull for blisters, distortions and hull cracks.
- Make sure your engine intake sea strainer is free of corrosion and properly secured.
- Check the engine shaft and rudder stuffing boxes for looseness. After launch, check stuffing boxes and through-hulls for leaks.
- Use a hose to check for deck leaks at ports and hatches. Replace caulk or gaskets as necessary.

Perform the following checks on outdrives and outboard engines:

- Inspect rudder outdrive bellows for cracked, dried or deteriorated spots, looking especially in the folds. Replace if suspect.
- Check power steering and power trim oil levels. Replace worn-out zines.
- Inspect the outer jacket of control cables. Cracks or swelling indicate corrosion and mean the cable has to be replaced.


